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Kyushu is the closest overseas starting point you can reach for your bike.

Although you start from a familiar street, the moment you step onto Japan's uniquely organized roads, a completely different rhythm unfolds.

Day1 부산항 Busan Port

Starting from Busan Port and crossing the sea, it's time to prepare for the start of your Kyushu riding journey and calmly build anticipation for new routes

Day2 시모노세키 Shimonoseki - 히라도 Hirado

Enter Shimonoseki and travel along the coastal road to Hirado, experiencing fishing village scenery, fresh seafood, and Japanese street culture together

Day3 하우스텐보스 Huis Ten Bosch - 나가사키 Nagasaki

Passing through Huis Ten Bosch and heading to Nagasaki, this section offers European-style streets, the atmosphere of a port city, and a captivating night view

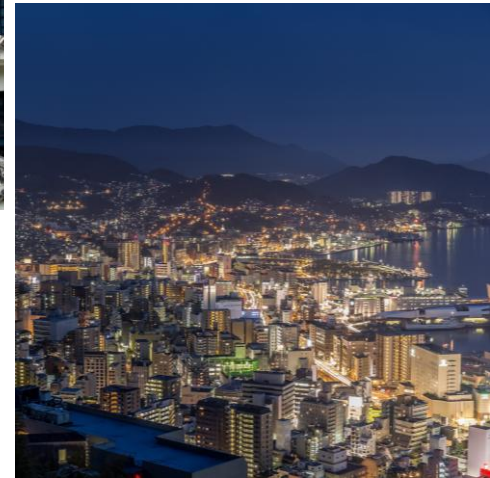
From Home to Overseas Ride

Kyushu is the most realistic overseas ride you can take straight to your bike. Crossing borders with my familiar equipment without complicated preparations adds extra depth to the journey. With a short trip, you'll encounter a completely different road environment and riding culture, and naturally experience the flow where the journey itself becomes the goal.

This journey, where you experience both clear changes and a sense of distinction even over close distances, is the best choice for starting your overseas ride.



Kyushu offers the closest overseas riding experience you can start with your own bike. With minimal preparation, riders cross into a new riding culture, where familiar control meets completely different roads, rhythm, and atmosphere.

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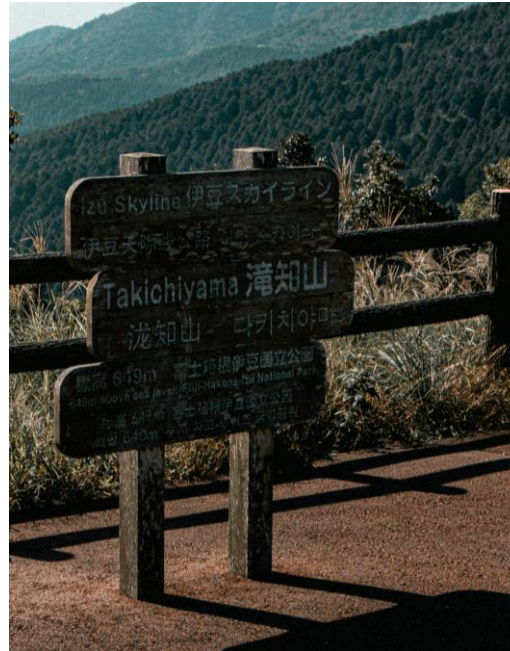
Where Riding Becomes Standard

Japan's roads are highly refined environments that riders around the world use as benchmarks.

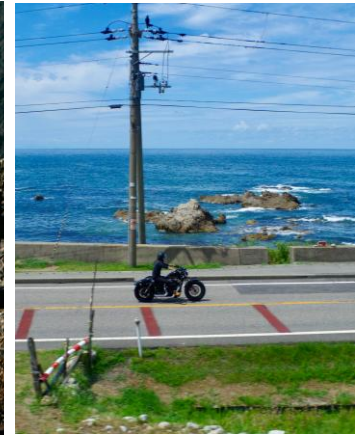
Precisely designed corners, stable road surfaces, and traffic systems that consider flow enhance the immersion of the driving experience.

Kyushu is a region with low traffic and a high natural presence, where you can most truly experience the natural completeness of the roads.

In an environment where you can focus on the road without unnecessary tension, riding goes beyond simple movement into a complete experience.



Japan's roads are considered a global standard for riders. In Kyushu, smooth surfaces, well-designed curves, and low traffic create a pure riding environment where focus, flow, and control come together seamlessly.

Ride, Recover, Ride Again

Kyushu offers unique riding courses built on volcanic terrain. Aso's vast calderas, coastal roads, and high-altitude roads create ever-changing landscapes and driving rhythms. The fatigue accumulated during this process is naturally relieved through the hot springs. Soaking in a hot spring at the end of the day is not just a simple rest, but a time to recover for the next day's ride. The journey becomes more complete in the flow of running, unwinding, and running again.



Kyushu's volcanic landscape creates dynamic riding routes across calderas, coastlines, and highlands. After each ride, natural hot springs provide deep recovery, completing a cycle of ride, rest, and ride again.

Food Culture

Kyushu's food culture naturally deepens throughout your riding journey. In areas facing the sea, fresh seafood is available, and each region has its own unique ingredients and cooking methods. In particular, kaiseki captures the flow of the seasons and local ingredients, turning from a simple meal into an experience. A meal encountered between rides enriches the rhythm of your journey.

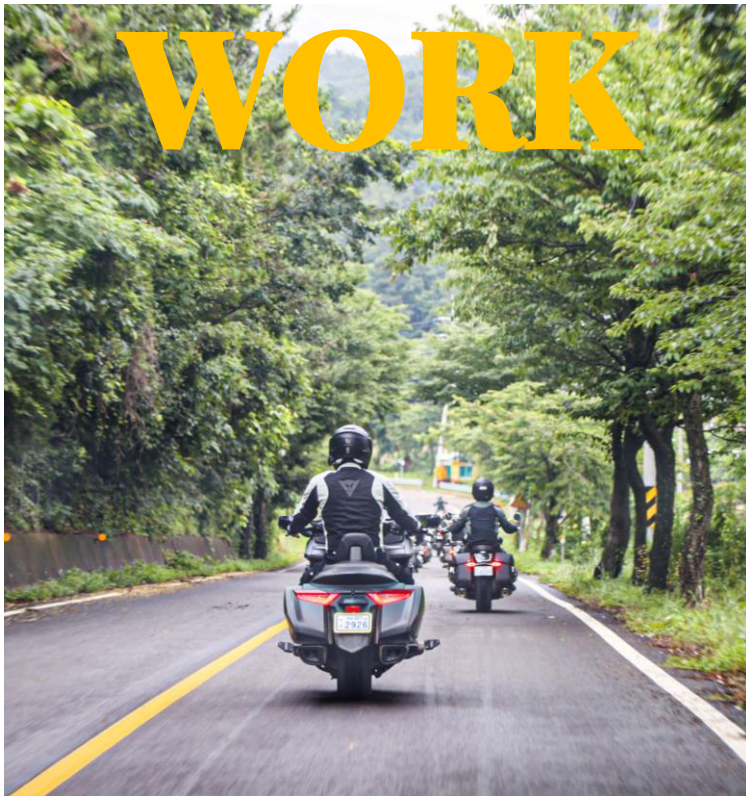
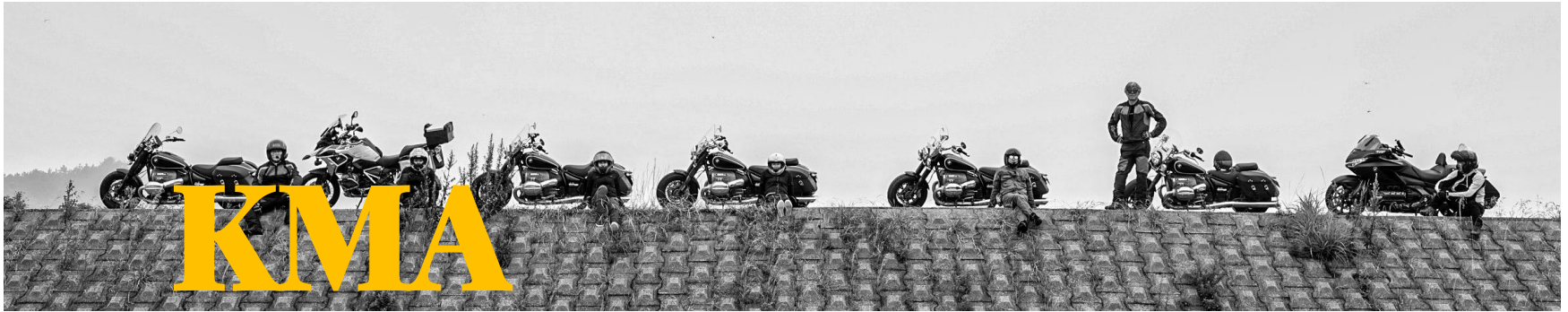


Accommodation
