The DMZ Gangwon Tour starts from Seoul, the capital of South Korea, passes Chuncheon, famous for its lakes and dakgalbi, and passes through Seoraksan, Korea's third highest and third highest mountain, traveling along the border with the East Sea.

Ride the Border of Korea

The DMZ Gangwon Tour starts from Seoul, the capital of South Korea, and is known for its lakes and gourmet cuisine.

Passing Chuncheon and Seoraksan, Korea's iconic mountain, it runs along the East Sea and the military border area.

It's a special riding journey.

Crossing massive mountain passes and ridges, you encounter deep valleys and magnificent natural scenery shaped by the four seasons, and drive along a path that connects the clear waters and rugged coastline of the northern East Sea.



Overview



Day1~2 ^{서울} Seoul - ^{속초} Sokcho

Departing from Seoul, the capital of South Korea, passing through the lakeside city of Chuncheon, we head to Seoraksan, the mountain most beloved by Koreans.

Day3 ^{속초} Sokcho - ^{양구} Yanggu

Starting from Sokcho, the gateway city of the East Sea, the route continues to the historic coastal town of Hwajinpo, where Kim Il-sung's villa is located, and to the northernmost checkpoint of National Route 7

Day4 ^{양구} Yanggu - ^{서울} Seoul

Starting from Yanggu Punchball, a battlefield known as a fierce battleground during the Korean War, it passes through the GOP observatory with frontline views and continues to Imjingak

Entering Korea's Natural Scale

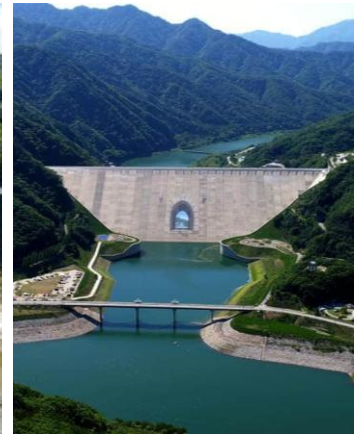
Leaving Seoul, the capital of South Korea, the journey begins by passing through Chuncheon, famous for dakgalbi and makguksu, and heading to Seoraksan, beloved by Koreans.

On the mountain pass trail, you encounter the deep local flavors such as dried pollack and wild vegetable dishes, and potato pancakes, while lush mountains and the blue horizon of the East Sea stretch on.

In Sokcho, you can experience Abai sundae, mulhoe, fresh seafood, and the lively atmosphere of traditional markets, making the ride a journey where scenery and cuisine come together.



From Seoul into Seoraksan, the route enters Korea's mountain spine. As landscapes deepen, the ride shifts into nature's rhythm, revealing the scale of the land.



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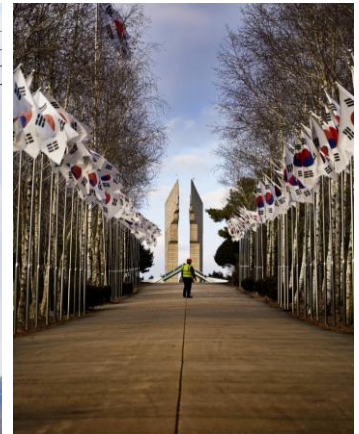
Where History Stays Visible

Entering the DMZ section, the landscape reveals a different texture. Passing through Hwajinpo, which meets the northern limit of the East Sea, Kim Il-sung's villa, and the Jaejin checkpoint at the northernmost point, you will directly face the tense view of North Korean land.

Along the road ahead, you follow the traces of a war that still hasn't ended, and with every step, you can feel the marks left by the time of division.



Along the DMZ, the ride passes historic sites and checkpoints. Silence and tension coexist, turning the journey into a direct encounter with Korea's divided past.



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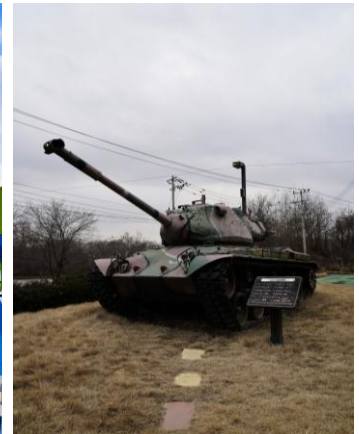
From Ride to Reflection

Starting from Yanggu, famous for its punchball and the fiercest battleground of the Korean War, you pass through unique curved landscapes created by basin terrain surrounded by mountains before heading to the GOP Observatory.

Here, you will face the reality of the border region with a tense view of North Korean land. Next, you will travel to Imjingak, following the scenery left by the time of division, and calmly conclude a journey where the boundaries of nature and history coexisted as you return to Seoul, the capital of South Korea.



From Yanggu to Imjingak, the journey gains meaning. The ride becomes more than movement, leaving a lasting reflection on nature, history, and the border.

Food Culture

The food culture on the DMZ journey is closer to local daily life than to glamour. Dakgalbi, makguksu, dried pollack and wild vegetables, and fresh seafood all deliver a light yet deep flavor. A single meal is an experience of slowly embracing the temperature and time of this land.

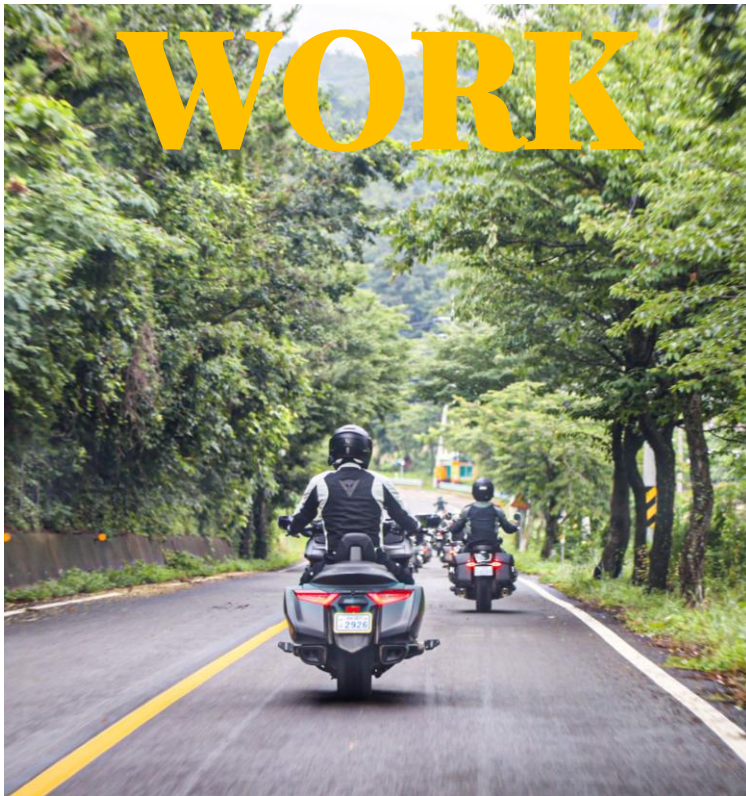
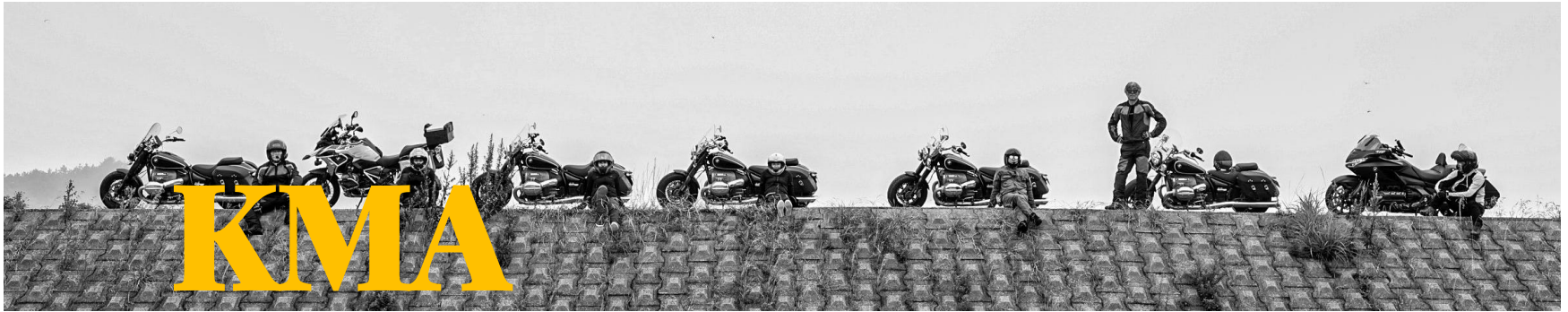
Accommodation

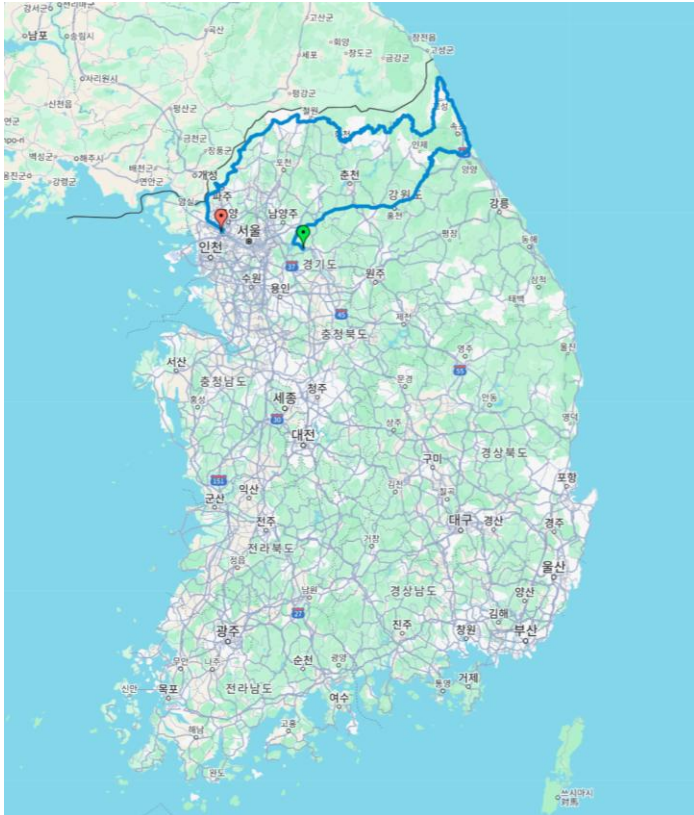
